

DATE ACTION

1.	October 18, 2023	The Biden Administration let the international embargo on Iran's missile and drone program lapse.
2.	October 20, 2023	The Biden Department of Defense allowed a senior Pentagon official involved in Iran Nuclear Deal negotiations to keep her top-secret security clearance, despite accusations that she was spying for Iran. Republican Senators have called for a full Congressional review of Ariane Tabatabai's clearance investigation.
3.	November 4, 2023	After the Hamas terror attack on Oct.7, former President Obama said, "Nobody's hands are clean."
4.	November 14, 2023	Senate Democrats unanimously voted to block a bipartisan attempt to send aid to Israel, just one month after it was brutally attacked by Hamas.
5.	November 17, 2023	The Biden Administration directed Executive Branch agencies to prepare visa bans and sanctions for Israeli settlers in the West Bank.
6.	December 14, 2023	The Biden Administration told the Israeli government to end its ground campaign in Gaza.
7•	January 19, 2024	President Joe Biden pressed Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu to scale down Israel's war against Hamas terrorists, stressing he is not in it for a year of war.
8.	January 26, 2024	More than 3 months after the Oct. 7 attacks in which at least 12 UNRWA employees participated, Biden's State Department finally paused payments to UNRWA.
9.	February 1, 2024	Biden's Executive Order 14115 gave the State Department broad authority to arbitrarily punish Israelis in Judea and Samaria, with no defined standards for determining when sanctions are warranted.



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10.	February 6, 2024	Amid ongoing skirmishes between Israel and Hezbollah, the Biden Administration asked Israel to keep its fighter jets out of Lebanese airspace.
11.	February 8, 2024	President Biden called the IDF's military operation in Gaza "over the top."
12.	February 8, 2024	Biden's National Security Memorandum 20 falsely implies that Israel is committing mass war crimes in its campaign against Hamas and threatens to cut off aid unless Israel meets arbitrary deadlines for providing "assurances" regarding international humanitarian law.
13.	February 19, 2024	The Biden Administration drafted a resolution for the U.N. to support a temporary Gaza ceasefire and oppose a Rafah assault to eradicate Hamas. When that failed, Biden's diplomats vetoed a different resolution for an immediate ceasefire.
14.	February 28, 2024	The Biden Administration launched an investigation into an Israeli company that produces parts for the Iron Dome.
15.	March 3, 2024	Vice President Kamala Harris called for an "immediate ceasefire" in Gaza during a major speech in Selma, Alabama.
16.	March 5, 2024	Biden's State Department hosted high-level talks with a Qatari delegation including an official who has praised Hamas and called for missile strikes on Israel.
17.	March 7, 2024	In his State of the Union address, President Biden said, "The only real solution is a two-state solution."
18.	March 9, 2024	Biden called Israel's plans to clear Hamas from its last stronghold in the city of Rafah a "red line" that Israel shouldn't cross.
19.	March 13, 2024	The Biden Administration reapproved a sanctions waiver that unlocks upwards of \$10 billion in frozen funds for the Iranian government.
20.	March 14, 2024	In a widely-panned speech on the floor of the United States Senate, Senate Democrat Leader Chuck Schumer called for a new government in Israel. Senator Schumer also called both Netanyahu and Hamas "obstacles to peace."
21.	March 15, 2024	Biden praised Schumer's speech calling for a new government in Israel.
22.	March 22, 2024	The United States submitted a draft resolution to the United Nation Security Council calling for an immediate ceasefire between Israel and Hamas in Gaza. The resolution is widely seen as an end of stalwart U.S. support for Israel at the United Nations.
23.	March 25, 2024	The United Nations Security Council passed a resolution demanding an immediate ceasefire between Israel and Hamas in the Gaza Strip. Biden's diplomats abstained from the vote, allowing it to pass. The resolution decoupled a demand for a ceasefire from a demand for the release of hostages. It also made no mention of Oct. 7 or Hamas.
24.	March 28, 2024	Biden's State Department undermined Israel's ability to finish taking out Hamas's remaining battalions and recovering hostages. The State Department posted on social media that a "major military ground movement in Rafah risks killing more civilians. It risks wreaking greater havoc with the provision of humanitarian assistance. It risks further isolating Israel around the world and jeopardizing its long-term security and standing."
25.	April 3, 2024	Biden's Special Envoy for Yemen said that the U.S. would consider revoking the recent designation of the Houthis as terrorists if they cease their shipping attacks in the Red Sea.
26.	April 4, 2024	In a phone call with Netanyahu, Biden demanded an "immediate ceasefire" by Israel. Biden also threatened to place conditions on aid to Israel if Israel does not act to "protect innocent lives."
27.	April 5, 2024	Rep. Nancy Pelosi and 36 Democrats called for Biden to stop the transfer of U.S. weapons to Israel.
